You don't own the music.

Typical Cost for Full Features (\$10 per month)


Requires Internet Access

Most profits go to big music entities and tech companies

Collect user information - Privacy

Album Covers and notes are diminished

Playlists – used to organize, present and share music

Curated Playlists – e.g. Top 80's Rock & Roll, Baby Making Music, Workout, Mood Booster

Share & Use Playlists from friends, even celebrities

Playlists that you create from your favorites

Offline – Play Music without WiFi/Internet or Cellular data • You Pay for Home Internet with a monthly fee with no or high data limits • Cellular Data is more expensive and often based on data volume. • How much data are we talking about? • Spotify requires 40MB of data per hour of music (xfinity mobile = \$.60 per hour)

Features

Offline – Play Music without WiFi/Internet or Cellular data When?

- Car, plane, travel
- Out and about with no WiFi
- Only available with paid or premium plans

Offline – Play Music without WiFi/Internet or Cellular data How does it work?

- 1. Select a song, album or playlist
- 2. Download to storage on your device.
- 3. Enable Offline
- 4. Play the downloaded music





