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




Alternative Ways to Release the Shutter

Burst Photos

Older iPhone - Press and Hold Shutter

iPhone 11 + Swipe (Shift) Shutter to Left



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View/Select Individual Photos

- In the Photos app
- Display the Burst
- Tap Select
- Photos appear in timeline
- Put check mark on photos you wish to keep Tap Done to Save. Select option to keep Everything or only checked



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Alternative Ways to Release the Shutter

Timer


- Older iPhone: Tap Timer at Top
- New iPhone :
- 1. Tap ^ then
- 2. Tap Timer
- 3. Chose 3 or 10 secs
- 4. Tap Shutter to start timer





- In Photo mode, Touch &
- Hold Shutter to take quick video
- Slide Shutter to right for hands-free recording with both Record and Photo button





Zoom

Optical vs Digital Zoom Better to zoom with your feet then digital

Digital Zoom – Pinch Screen in or out

Optical If your iPhone has more than one lens,

tap: .5 or 1x 2 or 3 (varies by model)

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- Tap the Area of Focus •
- Slide up & down to adjust exposure (brightness)
- Long Press to Lock (AE/AF Lock) Allows • you to move the camera without change.

Composition - Rule of Thirds

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iPhone Grid Support



Launch the Settings app. Scroll down and tap Camera Find Grid (near the top) and turn it on

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Available on iPhone 6s and later Live Photo is on by default



Play a Live Photo

Press and Hold on the photo inside the Photos App to see the motion

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Live Photo Effects

Display Live Photo Tap Live to see Effects • Live – normal • Loop – repeating loop • Bounce – repeating forward and backward • Long – long exposure e.g. Fireworks

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Turn Live Photos Off with Preserve Settings

Preserve Settings Options

- 1. Open the Camera app.
- Tap the yellow Live Photo icon so it is off (white with a slash through it) This is the setting you want to preserve.
- 3. Open the Settings app.
- Scroll down to find and tap the Camera settings.
- 5. Tap Preserve Settings.
- Tap the Live Photo slider so it is Green. (Green is on)

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Apply Color Filters for dramatic affects

Mono – Black & White Filters can also be

applied in the Photos app after the photo is taken

Modes



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Video Mode

Shutter Button Turns Red

Tap Shutter to Record • Shutter turns square

Tap again to stop
 While recording video, tap White

Shutter to take photo

QuickTake Video Press and hold shutter while in Photo Mode

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Pano


Take Panoramic Photos with Pano Mode



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Taking a Pano



- 1. Switch to Pano
- 2. Tap Shutter
- 3. Move Horizontal
- 4. Tap Shutter to End

Slow Motion Video

Slo-mo Mode Video Records as normal Slow-motion when you play it back

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Slo-mo in Three steps

- 1. Choose Slo-Mo
- 2. Record by tapping the shutter or other

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Playback

 Tap Thumbnail
 Access from Photos

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Slo-Mo Summary

Choose Slow-Mo Record like regular Video Playback for Slowmotion effect Get Creative

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Time Lapse Video

Create a time-lapse video of a lengthy experience

Example: 3 minute time lapse video of US Bank Stadium Construction (32 months of construction)

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Time-Laps in Five Steps

- 1. Choose Time Lapse
- 2. Prop iPhone in position or use a tripod
- Press Shutter like with Video
 Capture the Experience
- 4. Press Shutter to End
- 5. Playback (Thumbnail or in
- Photos app)

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




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Time-Lapse Summary



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Portrait Mode

Provides Two Photo Effects

- 1. Depth-of-Field effect
- 2. Lighting Effects



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Which iPhones have Portrait?

iPhone 8 Plus iPhone SE (2nd & 3rd Generation) iPhone X (All) iPhone 11 - 14 (All)

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1 - Depth of Field Effect

Apple Defines this as a "Background Blur"



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Depth Control in Four Steps

- 1. Choose Portrait Mode
- 2. Tap Depth Control Icon 🕑
- 3. Drag the Depth Control Slider to adjust
- 4. Tap the Shutter

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Depth Control in Four



Portrait Depth Control

Shallow Depth of Field - f1.4 Small area of Focus More Blur in Background

Deep Depth of Field - *f* 16 · Larger area in Focus · Background is more sharp and in focus

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Portrait Lighting

Studio-Quality Lighting Effects



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Portrait Lighting in Three Steps

- 1. Choose Portrait Mode
- 2. Follow onscreen tips for framing
- 3. Tap & Drag the Portrait Lighting Slider to adjust
- 4. Tap the Shutter

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Portrait Lighting in Three



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Best Feature about Portrait Mode

Tweak and even remove effects in the Photos App Select Photo Tap Edit

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Night Mode

Capture more detail in low-light situations Only available on iPhone 11 + Adjust exposure time as long as 10 seconds Hold Steady or use a tripod
