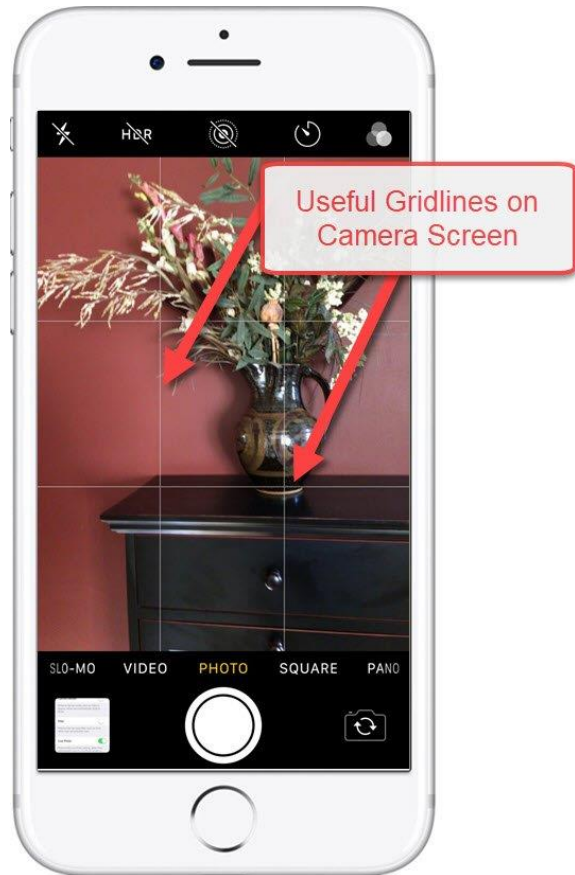

iPhone Grid Support



Turn on the Grid

Launch the **Settings** app.

Scroll down and tap **Camera**

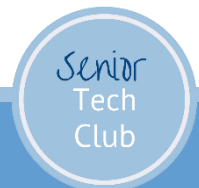
Find **Grid** (near the top) and turn it on

HDR Photos

High Dynamic Range

iPhone takes multiple photos to balance shadows and highlights.

It is a good photo approach to provide the best lighting when there is contrast.

HDR - Older iPhone

HDR command in the Camera App

Recommend Auto setting

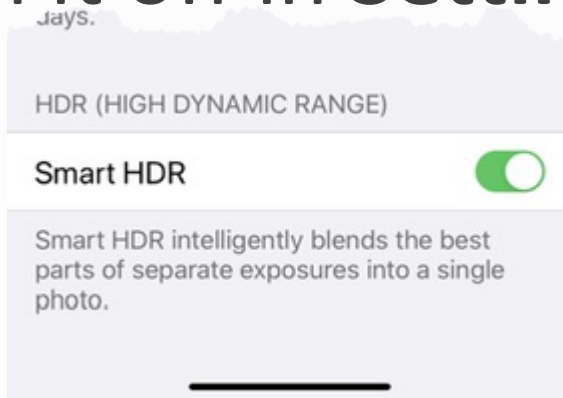


Newer iPhone +

Auto or Smart HDR is on by default

No switch in Camera app

Turn it off in **Settings, Camera**



Live Photos

Photo plus 1.5 seconds of video before and after the picture is taken.

Available on iPhone 6s and later

Live Photo is on by default

Turn on and off in the Camera App



Play a Live Photo

Press and Hold inside the Photos App

Live Photo Effects

Display Live Photo

Swipe up to see Effects

- Live – normal
- Loop – repeating loop
- Bounce – repeating forward and backward
- Long – long exposure e.g. Fireworks

Turn Live Photos Off

Preserve Settings Options

1. Open the **Camera** app.
2. Tap the yellow Live Photo icon so it is off (white with a slash through it) This is the setting you want to preserve.
3. Open the **Settings** app.
4. Scroll down to find and tap the **Camera** settings.
5. Tap **Preserve Settings**.
6. Tap the **Live Photo** slider so it is Green. (Green is on)

Modes



Video Mode

Shutter Button Turns Red

Tap Shutter to Record

- Shutter turns square
- Tap again to stop

While recording video, tap White Shutter to take photo

Pano

Take Panoramic Photos with Pano Mode

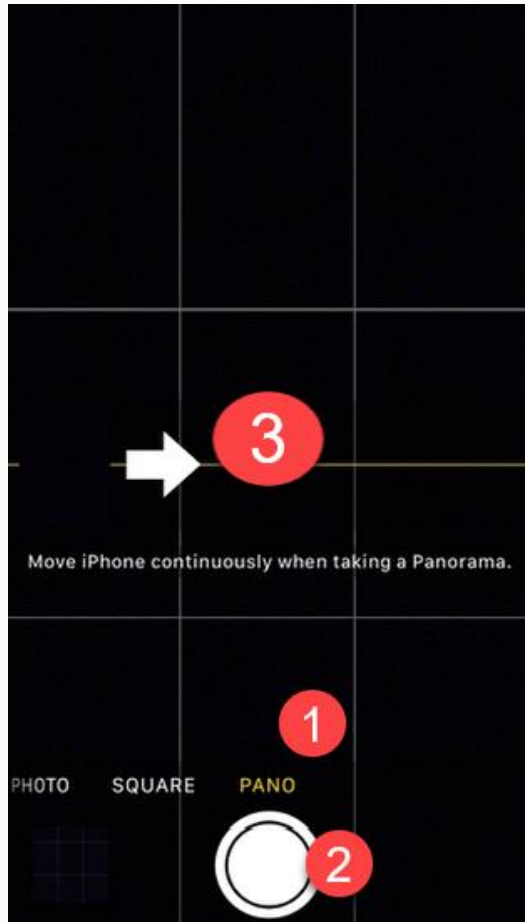
